In anticipation of the FY2022 Continuum of Care (CoC) federal funding competition, the Ocean County Homeless Prevention and Assistance Coalition (HPAC) hereby invites applications for new and renewal projects from community-based organizations. All agencies interested in implementing programs serving people experiencing homelessness are encouraged to apply, including those agencies that have not received HUD CoC funding previously. Funding for new projects will be determined according to applicable bonus funding available through the FY2022 NOFO and/or reallocation of funds from existing renewal programs.

New projects proposals may only apply for the following types of activities:

- Permanent supportive housing for the chronically homeless
- Rapid re-housing for the homeless
- Joint Transitional Housing and Permanent Housing – Rapid Rehousing that combine TH and PH-RRH into a single project to serve the homeless
- Dedicated Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) projects
- Supportive services Only projects for centralized or coordinated assessment systems
